Corporate information: The principal activity of the company is real estate project.

1. Significant accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, on accrual basis in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principle (GAAP), and comply with the Companies Accounting Standard specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"), read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014.

1.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which the results are known / materialised.

1.3 Property, Plant & Equipments

Property, Plant & Equipments are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. The cost comprises of purchase price, duties, levies and any directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to its working condition for the intended use.

1.4 Depreciation and Amortisation

(i) Tangible Assets

Depreciation on tangible fixed assets has been provided on straight line method as per useful life prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciable amount for assets is the cost of an asset or other amount substituted for cost less its estimated residual value.

1.5 Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realisable values. Cost of inventories comprises of cost of land, rates and taxes, other direct expenditure and other incidental expenses.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents:

The Company considers all highly liquid financial instruments, which are readily convertible into cash and have maturities of three months or less from the reporting date, to be cash equivalents. Financial instruments which are having maturities of twelve months or less from the reporting date are considered to be a part of current assets. All other financial instruments except the above are considered to be a part of non-current assets.

1.7 Revenue Recognition

A. Revenue will be recognised when the undivided share in property is conveyed to the ultimate customer by way of Sale Deed.

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

B. Interest income is recognised on the time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and rate applicable.

1.8 Employee Benefits

Short-term employee benefits are recognized as expenses in the Profit and Loss account of the year in which the related service is rendered at the undiscounted amount as and when it accrues.

1.9 Provision for Current and Deferred Tax

Provision for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax resulting from "timing difference" between taxable and accounting income is accounted for using the tax rates and lows that are enacted or substantively enacted as on the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets is recognised and carried forward only to the extent that there is a virtual certainty that the asset will be realised in future.

1.10 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provision is recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Disclosure for Contingent Liabilities is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, requires an outflow of resources. No provision is recognized or disclosure for Contingent Liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation and the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote. Contingent Asset is neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

1.11 Impairment of Assets

An asset is treated as impaired when the carrying cost of assets exceeds its recoverable value. An impairment loss is charged to the Profit and Loss Account in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. The impairment loss recognized in prior period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of recoverable amount.

1.12 Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalised as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to Profit and Loss Account.

1.13 Earnings per share:

The Earnings Per Share (EPS) is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss attributable to the equity shareholders by weighted average number of equity shares outstanding at the end of the year. The weighted average number of Equity Shares is arrived at after taking into consideration the bonus issue, rights issue, buy back etc. if any, during the year.

1.14 Other expenses:

All major items of expenses are accounted for on accrual basis and necessary provisions for the same are made on a prudent basis.
